INFORMATION TO NEW STUDENTS'

Dear Students,

Once again welcome to Muni University for the academic year 2016/2017 and congratulations upon your admission.

Please read this information to guide you as you as you prepare to report to Muni University.

1. Reporting

- i. Report in time as indicated in your admission letters and the semester calendar.
- ii. On arrival, report to the office of Dean of Students for immediate registration and direction to your respective hostels
- iii. Those travelling in the night will arrive at around **5:00-6:00am**. Please keep at the bus terminal until **7:00am** and call to be directed in case it is your first time to come to Arua.
- iv. Avoid picking Boda Bodas from undesignated places to avoid getting into wrong hands. Take note of the number plate of any transport means you use for easy tracking in case of a problem.
- v. Average transport for boda boda is **1,500-2000 Ush** from the bus terminals to the University Main Campus; depending on the capacity of your luggage and your ability to negotiate.
- vi. We do not have commuter services, therefore be careful when someone offers you a special car hire service.
- vii. The guild office is organizing for Bazaar trade to enable you buy simple items ranging from mattresses, beddings and other house-hold items for use at affordable rate. Minimize traveling with heavy baggage.

2. Orientation

All new students admitted to Muni University will be taken through an orientation program to help you to know and adjust to the new environment, program and systems of the university. You are therefore urged to report in time to attend the program.

3. Financial Support

All government sponsored students will receive financial support in form of living out allowance. This allowance is minimal as compared to the prevailing market prices on goods and services. You are therefore requested to come with extra money to supplement on the allowance to enable you meet your welfare needs with minimal challenge.

Secondly, your allowance will be processed according to the date you arrive and report to the university and register. The more you delay to report, the less amount you will get as compared to your fellow colleagues. There should be no complaints arising from this difference later.

It is also important to pay for your accommodation a month or two on reporting as you wait for the allowance. This is because accommodation is private and Hostel owners may need some money to facilitate your stay. Information on accommodation is available on the website as well. You can check out for one.

Staff and fellow students will be readily available to help you from time to time. Do not shy off or hesitate to seek information where you do not understand.
