1.0. Introduction

The Bachelor of Education (Primary) programme is fully accredited by National Council for Higher Education (NCHE).

2.0. Programme rationale

The programme is well aligned to the National Teacher Policy; of training and recruiting graduate primary teachers. BED (P) programme is designed to train and produce highly motivated teachers, Headteachers, and other caliber of school administrators who are equipped with specialized professional, administrative, and content competencies to improve the teaching and learning outcomes, and general administration in primary schools.

3.0. Programme learning outcomes

Upon successful completion of the programme, the graduate should be able to:

- [1] competently teach Primary School Curriculum content and provide effective leadership and management of Primary School affairs.
- [2] carry out effective assessment of teaching and learning outcomes in the Primary Schools.
- [3] plan and effectively supervise Primary School Programmes.
- [4] design programmes to mentor junior teachers to design and produce teaching and learning materials for different subjects using locally available resources.
- [5] use modern technological facilities for effective teaching and learning in Primary schools.
- [6] facilitate the relationship between various subjects and everyday life within the pupils' environment to enhance holistic development of the child.
- [7] create a positive attitude in fellow teachers and pupils towards the learning of different subjects.
- [8] provide leadership in promoting equality and equity for the disadvantaged.
- [9] motivate teachers and students to facilitate teaching and learning under various circumstances.

4.0. Entry Requirements

The entry requirement for the BED (P) programme is a Diploma in Education (Primary), of at least a Credit pass or Second Class Lower division from a recognized institution.

5.0. Delivery of the Programme

The BED (P) is a three (3) year programme, equivalent to six semesters of lectures and examinations. The lectures shall be delivered using the long-distance model and face-to-face sessions, conducted during the primary school holidays.
